# Personal, Social and Emotional Development

- See themselves as a valuable individual.

### Maths

- Find and match objects which are the same, sort objects according to colour, size or shape.
- Use the words 'fewer', 'the same' and 'more' to compare groups of objects.
- Compare and order objects according to their size.
- Use mathematical words to describe size
- Copy, continue and create a simple repeating pattern e.g.: red, yellow, red, yellow, red, yellow.
- Focus on numbers 1, 2, 3 counting,
   subitising (instantly recognising a number of objects without the need to count them)

- Learn new words and use throughout the day.
- Understand how to listen carefully and why listening is important.
- Articulate their ideas and thoughts in well-formed sentences.
