Your child will also be bringing home a non-worded reading book each week. These allow your child to practice story telling and vocabulary. These are changed each Wednesday.

## Phonics Learning

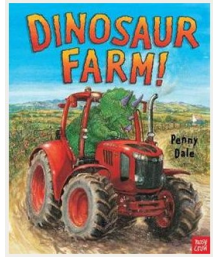
### Our School Bedtime Book Initiative

These books are a great chance for you to share a new book at bedtime. The aim is for the adult to read to the child and to spend time together enjoying a good book!

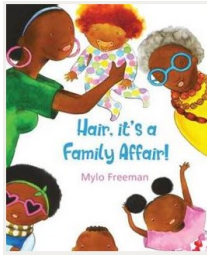


### Dinosaur Farm! by Penny Dale
